Committed young people help single mothers

Teenagers mobilized to offer essential products to some thirty young single mothers.

On the occasion of International Women's Day, March 8, the LÉO Les Diamants club, made up of students from Armand-Corbeil high school and sponsored by the Quebec-Diabetes Lions Club, made a gesture of solidarity with these young mothers and their children.

To do this, the teenagers went to local pharmacies – particularly in Terrebonne and Mascouche – to obtain donations of products that were no longer saleable, i.e. products with a very close expiry date, samples, test products, etc.

They then asked pharmacy owners if they could give them free of charge so that they could donate to the MOM'S organization, which helps young single mothers.
